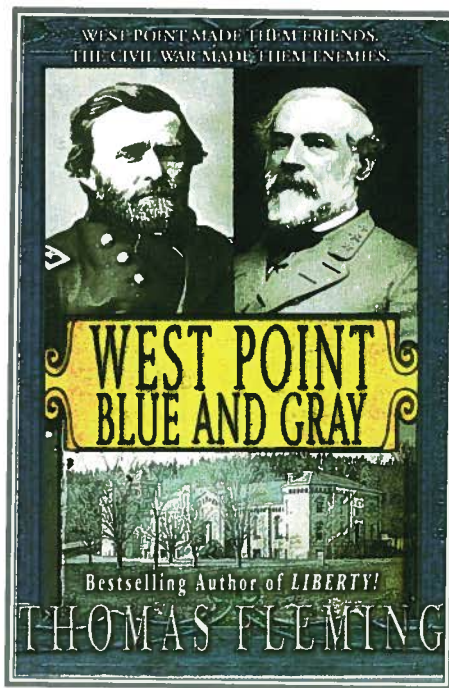

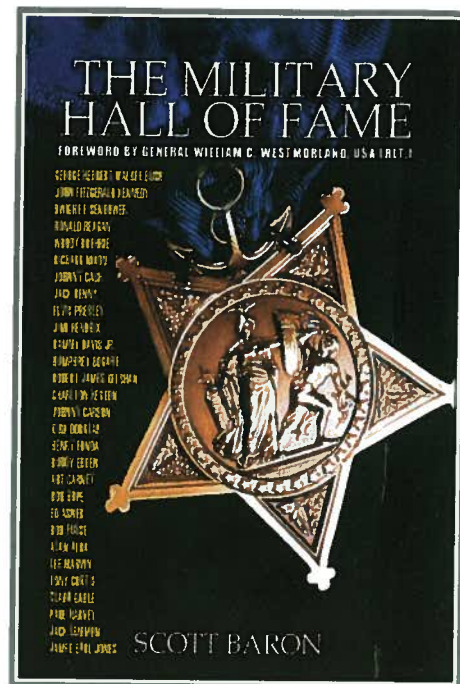
West Point Blue and Gray

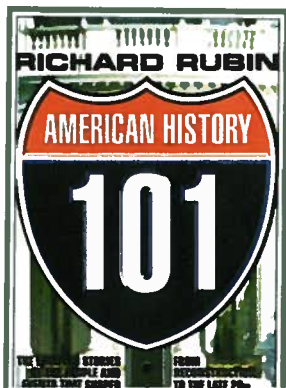

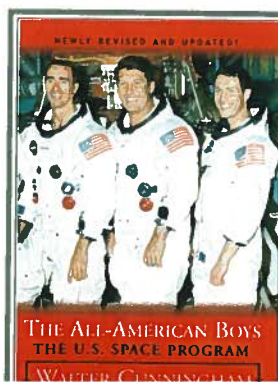
