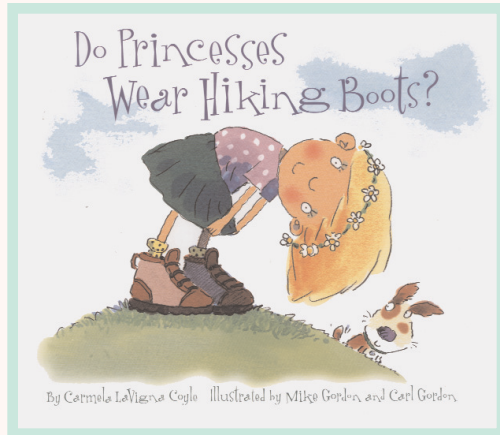

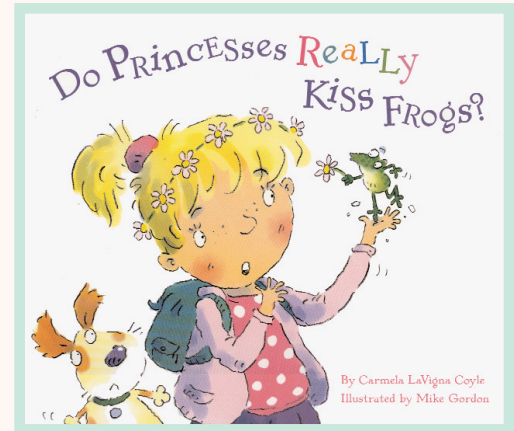


DO PRINCESSES WEAR HIKING BOOTS?

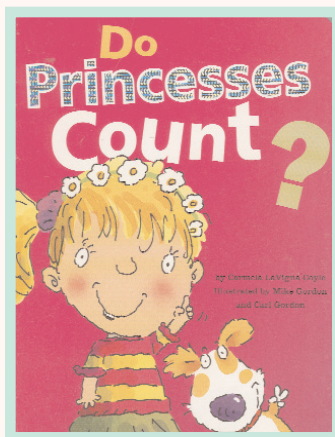
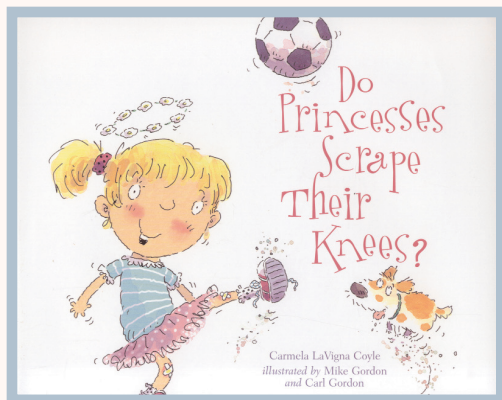


DO PRINCESSES REALLY KISS FROGS?
