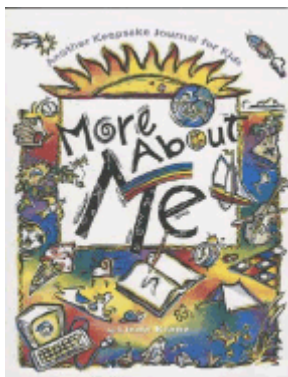


More About Me:
